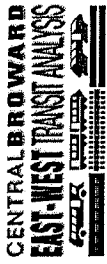

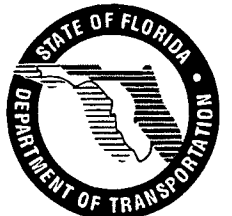

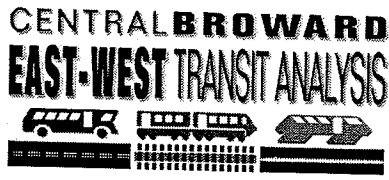

5. Short head ways are a must.

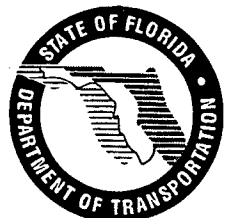
6. A particular station should be able to accommodate E-W & N-S commuters so that a Round Trip commuter can easily get to his car or feeder line.

Summary of the Tier 1 Public Workshop Plantation High School, June 26, 2003

The first public workshop on the Tier 1 alternatives was held on June 26, 2003, at Plantation High School. The purpose of the workshop was to present the results of the Tier 1 analysis and to receive input from the public about these alternatives. The Tier 1 analysis examined connectivity to major destinations and other transit studies, the number of households and employees within ½ mile of proposed stations, opportunities for economic and/or transit oriented development, potential for environmental impacts, transportation disadvantaged populations in the study area, and projected capital and operating costs for each alternative.

The following is an excerpt from the “Conceptual Definition of Alternatives Report” that summarizes the workshop.

On June 26, 2003, a public workshop was held in the Auditorium of Plantation High School. Public notification for the workshop was provided in the Sun-Sentinel twice prior to the workshop. A notice about the workshop was also placed on the study website. The workshop included a PowerPoint presentation of the Tier 1 evaluation and several study boards. Attendees had to opportunity to interact informally with the study team members both before and after the presentation. Comment forms were available and attendees were encouraged to record their comments on these forms. The issues raised during the workshop included the feasibility of using the canal on the north side of I-595 as an exclusive transit lane, impacts to residences along Sunrise Boulevard, projected capital and operating costs, and coordination with other transit studies and systems.
